KOOINDAH WATERS BOUNCES BACK FROM WILD WEATHER

New South Wales Central Coast golf course, Kooindah Waters Golf Club, has bounced back from the wild weather, to re-open without damage.

The course received more than 520 ml of rain during the extreme weather of the past few weeks, causing floodwaters over a majority of the course.

Director of Golf at Kooindah Waters, Brendan Currie said the design and natural location of the course, meant that no damage was sustained during the floods.

“Golf course architect Ross Watson has created a course which encompasses eco-design principals through the incorporation of existing wetlands,” Mr Currie said.

“Not only does the course have a natural drainage system through the wetlands, but drainage has been a focus in Ross’ course design.

“The playing surfaces have been built higher than the natural water levels so they don't get affected significantly, and water can run off into the wetland system,” he said.

Mr Currie said the course had re-opened for walking only and carts would be back on course by this weekend depending on the weather.

“Our maintenance team & clubhouse staff have been working overtime to ensure the course is back to its usual championship conditions.

“We look forward to welcoming back our loyal golfers who have been very understanding during the floods and the courses recuperation,” he said.

All the staff at Kooindah Waters would like to extend their best wishes and a speedy recovery to everyone who was affected by the recent weather.
